As the share of women in the military increases, so does the share of veterans who are women. The 2010 Current Population Survey estimates that there are just over 22 million veterans, almost 1.8 million of whom are women (8%); and among the estimated 2.2 million post-9/11 veterans, more than 400,000 (19%) are women.

Women in the U.S. Military: Growing Share, Distinctive Profile

Throughout history women have been almost universally barred from formally serving in combat units of national militaries. Since the late 1960s, women in liberal western countries have gained equal rights and opportunities in all other areas of public service except the military.

Women in Combat: Adaptation and Change in the US Military

The women who donned military uniforms in the American Revolutionary War led the way for those women who wear the uniforms of today's military. - The 1987 Study Group on the Progress of Women in the Navy found that over half of the 1,400 women interviewed had been victims of sexual harassment while in the Navy.
- The Department of Defense Task Force on Women in the Military in January, 1988, reported that sexual harassment remains a “significant problem” in all the services.
